

What is Bylvay® (odevixibat)?

Bylvay is a medicine to treat cholestatic pruritus (itch) in patients with Alagille syndrome as young as 12 months of age.

Living with Alagille syndrome

If you or your loved one is dealing with Alagille (pronounced a-luh-jeel) syndrome (ALGS), you know the journey has its challenges. This brochure can help you understand Alagille syndrome and address a key challenge: finding relief for the distressing itch—or "cholestatic pruritus"—to make the journey a bit more manageable.

What is Alagille syndrome?

Alagille syndrome is a rare genetic disease that causes damage to the liver, and can affect the heart, eyes, skeleton, kidnevs, face, and nervous system.

Words to know: Cholestatic pruritus

Your doctor may describe itch using this term. Cholestatic (pronounced koh-luh-stat-ik) means the flow of bile from the liver is slowed or blocked. Pruritus (pronounced proo-rahy-tuhs) is a medical term for itching.

Alagille syndrome is a progressive disease.

"Progressive" means that Alagille syndrome may get worse over time. Itching can be difficult to treat, but relief may be possible.



Itch from Alagille syndrome is more than normal itching—it can be frequent, deep, and frustrating

Living with Alagille syndrome

Signs of itch aren't always obvious

Babies and young kids may

Rub themselves or rub against objects

Kick their legs and be restless

Cry, be irritable and fussy

Struggle to fall and stay asleep

Older kids and adults may

Feel embarrassed or be impacted socially

Feel effects on mood

Struggle to concentrate

Struggle to fall and stay asleep

Disruptions due to the itch from Alagille syndrome can affect each patient and caregiver differently

What happens in a healthy liver?

In a healthy liver, bile acids drain from the liver to the small intestine. Up to 95% of the bile acids are then recycled back to the liver by the IBAT.

Words to know: Bile acids 🥻



Bile acids are created in the liver to break down food and release the nutrients inside.


Words to know: IBAT



The ileal bile acid transporter, or IBAT, recycles bile acids back into the liver from the intestines.

How Alagille syndrome affects the liver

- Bile acids don't drain properly out of the liver to the small intestine.
- Bile acids build up to a level that may be harmful to the liver.
- Excess bile acids spill into the bloodstream.



The buildup of bile acids in the liver and the bloodstream may be the cause of itch (cholestatic pruritus) in Alagille syndrome.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (CONT'D)

 Elevations in liver tests (for example, AST, ALT, TB) have been observed with use of Bylvay. The patient's healthcare provider will obtain liver tests before starting Bylvay and periodically during treatment with Bylvay. Patients should report to their healthcare provider any symptoms of liver problems (for example, nausea, vomiting, skin or the whites of eyes turn yellow, dark or brown urine, pain on the right side of the abdomen, loss of appetite)






How does Bylyay work?

Bylvay inhibits the IBAT and decreases bile acid recycling back to the liver

These bile acids then leave the body naturally as waste.



While the exact way Bylvay reduces itch isn't fully understood, IBAT inhibition may reduce bile acid buildup as measured by bile acid in the blood.

Ask your doctor if Bylvay can help with itch

Relief for any level of itch

Some people live with itch so long that it feels normal, even though it's not. For others, itch is frustrating and relentless. Bylvay works whether itch is mild or severe.

In the clinical trial for Bylvay:



Scratching was measured on a 5-point scale, with 0 meaning no itch and 4 meaning worst possible scratching.*

- Less scratching meant an improvement of 1 point or more
- Little or no itch was a score of 0 or 1 on the scale




^{*}Scratching scores were recorded twice daily by a caregiver.

Early and lasting reduction of itch (cholestatic pruritus) with Bylvay

In a clinical trial of 52 people, Bylvay improved caregiver-reported scratching severity as early as week 4 and sustained over 24 weeks in people with Alagille syndrome. By week 24,





Reduced itch was sustained through 48 weeks

Most common side effects

The most common side effects in Bylvay patients with Alagille syndrome were diarrhea, abdominal pain, bruising (hematoma), and decreased weight.

Reduce the itch from Alagille syndrome with Bylvay

Reduced itch may lead to better sleep



In the Bylvay clinical trial, caregivers were asked 7 questions about how itch disrupts their child's sleep

Reduced itch may lead to better sleep

By 24 weeks, Bylvay's itch relief helped patients experience*



fewer days needing soothing from a caregiver to fall asleep compared to 6% taking a placebo



fewer days needing help falling asleep compared to 10% taking a placebo



fewer days needing to sleep with a caregiver compared to 8% taking a placebo

*There were also questions about number of awakenings, days seeing blood due to scratching, days needing to take medication to sleep, and a daytime tiredness score.

The information shown about sleep disruption is a secondary outcome of the study. It was not analyzed to the same extent as the primary outcome about itch. Data should be reviewed with caution. If you have questions about this limitation, your doctor can help explain it further.

Ask your doctor if less itch with Bylvay can help you rest easier

There are options when taking Bylvay

If you are prescribed Bylvay, your doctor determines the right dose based on weight.

Bylvay capsules can be



Swallowed whole



Opened and mixed with a small amount of soft, room-temperature food



Opened and mixed with liquids such as breast milk, formula, or water

Bylvay is also available as Oral Pellets.

What to **know** about side effects

Can Bylvay cause side effects?

Anytime you're considering a new treatment for itch (cholestatic pruritus) from Alagille syndrome, it's important to understand the possible risks and benefits. Some patients with Alagille syndrome taking Bylvay may experience side effects. If you experience any side effects, you should immediately talk to your doctor.

The most common side effects seen in a clinical study of patients with Alagille syndrome were:

Diarrhea

A mild increase in the frequency of bowel movements or loose, watery stool consistency for typically less than 1 week.

Abdominal pain

Pain in the abdomen (belly).

Bruising (hematoma)

Broken blood vessels that led to blood collecting under the skin.

Weight loss

Change in how much patients weighed. Your doctor will monitor your weight.

What to do if side effects occur

You should always talk to your doctor first before stopping or changing your Bylvay dose. If you experience side effects, you should immediately talk to your doctor. Your doctor may change the dose or discontinue Bylvay depending on the side effects. Your doctor may recommend restarting Bylvay after the side effects resolve.

Indications and Usage

Bylvay is an ileal bile acid transporter (IBAT) inhibitor indicated for the treatment of cholestatic pruritus in:

- Patients 12 months of age and older with Alagille syndrome (ALGS)
- Patients 3 months of age and older with progressive familial intrahepatic cholestasis (PFIC)

Limitation of Use:

Bylvay may not be effective in a subgroup of PFIC type 2 patients with specific ABCB11 variants resulting in non-functional or complete absence of the bile salt export pump protein

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- Do not swallow the 200 mcg or 600 mcg capsule(s) containing Oral Pellets whole. These are intended to be opened and the contents mixed into soft food. Take Bylvay in the morning with a meal
- For patients taking bile acid binding resins, take Bylvay at least 4 hours before or 4 hours after taking a bile acid binding resin








