Uses

BYLVAY is a prescription medicine used:

• For the treatment of itching in patients 3 months of age and older with progressive familial intrahepatic cholestatis (PFIC).

Limitation of Use:

BYLVAY might not work for some PFIC type 2 patients who have specific *ABCB11* gene changes. Talk with your healthcare provider if you have questions.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

• You should not use BYLVAY if you have had or have an advanced stage of liver disease. Talk with your healthcare provider if you have any liver conditions.



Living with progressive familial intrahepatic cholestasis

If you or your loved one is dealing with progressive familial intrahepatic cholestasis (PFIC), you've already dealt with numerous challenges. This brochure can help you understand PFIC and address a key challenge: finding relief for the distressing itch or "cholestatic pruritus"—to make the journey a bit more manageable.

What is PFIC?


PFIC is a spectrum of rare, genetic disorders that can cause liver damage and severe itching.

Words to know: Cholestatic pruritus

Your doctor may describe itch using this term. **Cholestatic** (pronounced *koh-luh-íţŝţ-ik*) means the flow of bile from the liver is slowed or blocked. **Pruritus** (pronounced *proo-čŝţœtuhs*) is a medical term for itching.

PFIC is a progressive disease.

"Progressive" means that PFIC may get worse over time. Itching can be difficult to treat, but **relief may be possible**.





Living with progressive familial intrahepatic cholestasis

Signs of itch aren't always obvious



Babies and young kids may Rub themselves or rub against objects Kick their legs and be restless Cry, be irritable and fussy Struggle to fall and stay asleep

> Older kids and adults may Feel embarrassed

Feel impacts on self-esteem Feel effects on mood Struggle to fall asleep, or feel tired

What happens in a healthy liver?

In a healthy liver, bile acids drain from the liver to the small intestine. Up to 95% of the bile acids are then recycled back to the liver by the IBAT.

Words to know: Bile acids 🌺

Bile acids are created in the liver to break down food and release the nutrients inside.

Words to know: IBAT 💈

The ileal bile acid transporter, or IBAT, recycles bile acids back into the liver from the intestines.

How PFIC affects the liver

Bile acids don't drain properly out of the liver to the small intestine.

Bile acids build up to a level that may be harmful to the liver.



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Excess bile acids spill into the bloodstream.

The buildup of bile acids in the liver and the bloodstream may be the cause of itch (cholestatic pruritus) in PFIC.


IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (CONT'D)

Abnormal liver tests have been observed with use of BYLVAY. Liver tests should be
obtained before starting and periodically during therapy to monitor for liver injury.
Immediately report to your healthcare provider any signs or symptoms of liver
injury, such as nausea, vomiting, skin or the whites of eyes turn yellow, dark or
brown urine, pain on the right side of the abdomen, or loss of appetite.





Bylvay inhibits the IBAT and decreases bile acid recycling back to the liver These bile acids then leave the body naturally as waste.



While the exact way Bylvay reduces itch isn't fully understood, IBAT inhibition may reduce bile acid buildup as measured by bile acid in the blood.



Relief for any level of itch

Some people live with itch so long that it feels normal, even though it's not. For others, itch is frustrating and relentless. Bylvay works whether itch is mild or severe.

In the clinical trial for Bylvay:

Early and lasting reduction of itch (cholestatic pruritus) with Bylvay

In a clinical trial of 62 people, Bylvay improved caregiver-reported scratching severity as early as week 4 and sustained through 24 weeks in people with PFIC.

Over 24 weeks, 35% of patients taking Bylvay 40 mcg/kg/day and 30% of patients taking Bylvay 120 mcg/kg/day achieved little or no itch compared with 13% of patients taking placebo. By 48 weeks,*



of Bylvay patients achieved **little or no** itch

Over 24 weeks, 52% of patients taking Bylvay 40 mcg/kg/day and 32% of patients taking Bylvay 120 mcg/kg/day experienced less scratching compared with 11% of patients taking placebo. By 48 weeks,*



of Bylvay patients experienced **less scratching**

*In the extension trial, all 112 enrolled people received 120 mcg/kg/day of Bylvay.

Reduced itch was sustained through 96 weeks

Most common side effects

The most common side effects in Bylvay patients with PFIC were diarrhea, elevations in liver tests, vomiting, abdominal pain, and certain vitamin deficiencies.

Itch-related **sleep disruption** in patients with PFIC

There are limitations to the sleep disruption data, and results should be reviewed with caution. Further testing is required. If you have any questions, your doctor can help explain it further.



After the Bylvay clinical trial ended, a separate analysis was done on caregiver responses to 7 questions about sleep disruption.

Caregivers reported the following

- Days needing soothing from a caregiver to fall asleep
- · Days needing to sleep with a caregiver
- · Days needing help falling asleep

There were also questions about

- Seeing blood due to scratching
- Number of awakenings
- Days needing to take
 medications to induce sleep
- Daytime tiredness

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Itch-related **sleep disruption** in patients with PFIC

By 72 weeks, Bylvay patients who had ≥1-point improvement in itch score reported*



*By 24 weeks, patients taking Bylvay experienced 44% fewer days needing soothing from a caregiver to fall asleep compared with 8% taking placebo; 42% fewer days needing to sleep with a caregiver compared with 6% taking placebo; and 43% fewer days needing help falling asleep compared with 3% taking placebo.



• For patients taking bile acid binding resins, take BYLVAY at least 4 hours before or 4 hours after taking a bile acid binding resin.



What to **KnOw** about side effects

Can Bylvay cause side effects?

Anytime you're considering a new treatment for itch (cholestatic pruritus) from PFIC, it's important to understand the possible risks and benefits. Some patients with PFIC taking Bylvay may experience side effects. If you experience any side effects, you should immediately talk to your doctor.

The most common side effects seen in a clinical study of patients with PFIC were

Abnormal liver tests

Changes in laboratory tests related to the liver. Your doctor will order certain tests to monitor your liver function.

Diarrhea

A mild increase in the frequency of bowel movements or loose, watery stool consistency for typically less than 1 week.

Abdominal pain

Pain in the abdomen (belly).

Vomiting

Throwing up.

Low vitamin levels

Vitamin levels that are lower than normal. Your doctor will order blood tests to measure levels of vitamins and may prescribe supplementation (taking vitamin supplements).

What to do if side effects occur

You should always talk to your doctor first before stopping or changing your Bylvay dose. If you experience side effects, you should immediately talk to your doctor. Your doctor may change the dose or discontinue Bylvay depending on the side effects. Your doctor may recommend restarting Bylvay after the side effects resolve.

- For patients taking bile acid binding resins, take BYLVAY at least 4 hours before or 4 hours after taking a bile acid binding resin.
- There is a pregnancy safety study that collects outcome data in women taking BYLVAY during pregnancy. Pregnant women exposed to BYLVAY should report if they have used BYLVAY during pregnancy by calling 1-855-463-5127.
